Executive Summary

This Report underscores the critical role of the Government Legislative Agenda (GLA) in advancing the national development agenda under the Bottom-Up Economic Transformation Agenda (BETA). It examines the contribution of both the Executive and the Legislature arms of Government towards achieving the five pillars of BETA and the priorities outlined in the Fourth Medium-Term Plan (MTP IV). Particular focus has been laid on policy and legislative initiatives prioritized by the National Executive for accelerated delivery during the remainder of the term of the 13th Parliament.

The Report also highlights the important coordination role played by the Office of the Prime Cabinet Secretary (OPCS) and the State Department for Parliamentary Affairs (SDPA) in strengthening Executive–Legislative collaboration. This includes coordinating the GLA, facilitating the identification, prioritization, and tracking of key initiatives, and developing tools that support effective legislative coordination and parliamentary liaison in pursuit of the realization of the national development agenda.

These coordination tools include *the Public Policy Handbook for Kenya, the Guidelines for the Development of National Government Policy and Legislation, 2024* and the *Parliamentary Liaison Framework*. Meanwhile, the *Public Policy Monitoring and Evaluation Framework* and the *Stakeholders’ Engagement Framework* are still under development. Implementation will begin in earnest after conclusion of pending processes.

The SDPA has continued to play a key coordination and oversight role in implementing the GLA through structured engagements and consultations with MDAs. These engagements have provided a platform for reviewing legislative priorities, harmonizing sector positions and strengthening accountability mechanisms necessary for effective implementation of Government initiatives. They have also enabled the SDPA to drive alignment of priorities across MDAs, map key legislative interventions and promote collaboration in addressing emerging legal, policy and operational challenges affecting implementation.

In this regard, the 2026 GLA Prioritization Roundtables served as an essential forum for assessing progress in the implementation of the GLA and reviewing existing commitments considering the imminent expiry of the term of the 13th Parliament.

During these 2026 Roundtables, **558** key priorities were identified across various clusters: **149** priorities were identified in the Finance and Production cluster; **147** in Infrastructure; **103** in the Social cluster; **87** in Governance and Public Administration; while **72** priorities were identified in the Environmental and Natural Resources cluster.

The SDPA also engaged participating State Departments on their performance with respect to parliamentary appearances and responses, as highlighted in the inaugural Parliamentary Appearances (Plenary and Committees) Scorecard, 2025. There was bilateral agreement on the need to prioritize parliamentary business more effectively and to strengthen collaboration, particularly through improved data management and timely communication with the SDPA regarding parliamentary invitations and appearances.

At the conclusion of these Roundtables, the overall GLA portfolio grew from **1,308** to **1,358** initiatives comprising **299** policy initiatives, **339** legislative initiatives and **720** Statutory Instrument (SI) initiatives. Of these, 325 are concluded, 938 are ongoing and **94** are discontinued. These numbers represent a growth in ongoing initiatives and a drop in discontinued ones, signaling, amongst other things, a revisit of prior dropped initiatives by MDAs.

Despite the progress made, several challenges affect the implementation of the GLA. These challenges include funding constraints, high cost of development processes such as public participation, delayed action by process stakeholders, overlapping/conflicting mandates and initiatives, stakeholder divergence, inadequate technical capacities, private member Bills and delayed submission of progress reports. On its part, the parliamentary liaison service continues to raise concerns around conflicting parliamentary invitations from both Houses, delayed transmission of questions and invitations, unsupported responses and overlaps between Cabinet Secretary commitments and parliamentary schedules. To address these challenges, the SDPA has emphasized the need for increased funding and continuous building of MDAs' capacity on GLA and parliamentary liaison processes.

This Report therefore provides an analysis of the prioritization in the GLA, highlights the challenges affecting the achievement of targeted outputs and lays out a framework for effective coordination of the implementation and monitoring of the identified priorities.

The Report is organized into four Chapters: Chapter One presents an introduction to the prioritization exercise; Chapter Two outlines the methodology; Chapter Three covers the findings, analysis and outcomes of the Prioritization Roundtables; while Chapter Four presents the framework for coordinating the implementation and monitoring of identified priorities.

CHAPTER 1: INTRODUCTION

1.0 Background Information

As enumerated under Executive Order No. 1 of 2025, the functions of the Office of the Prime Cabinet Secretary include, *inter alia*, the coordination of the identification, prioritization and enactment of policies and legislation necessary to achieve the national development agenda, monitoring and evaluation of the progress of policy and legislative initiatives and providing timely guidance and direction on the appropriate measures to be undertaken to address challenges constraining the realization of the policy and legal framework necessary to achieve the national development agenda.

Domiciled in the Office of the Prime Cabinet Secretary is the SDPA which is mandated to coordinate the government legislative agenda and strengthen the linkage between the Executive and Parliament in the formulation, processing and enactment of Government policies and legislation. The State Department therefore plays a central role in coordinating the GLA, facilitating parliamentary liaison, strengthening inter-ministerial collaboration, and promoting efficient governance through structured policy and legislative coordination mechanisms. In undertaking this mandate, the State Department works closely with MDAs to ensure that Government policy and legislative initiatives are aligned with national development priorities and processed in accordance with established constitutional, legal and procedural requirements.

The GLA comprises Policies, Bills and SIs being pursued by MDAs to support the implementation of government programmes and projects. It therefore requires a structured mechanism for coordinating the legislative work of Government, ensuring coherence across sectors, enhancing accountability, minimizing duplication of efforts, and promoting timely enactment of legal and policy frameworks necessary for the achievement of the Bottom-Up Economic Transformation Agenda (BETA) and MTPIV priorities.

Since its establishment, the State Department has focused on institutionalizing the coordination of the GLA. These coordination efforts have significantly contributed to improving the timeliness of policy and legislative processes within Government. The impact of these efforts has been demonstrated through the approval of critical national policies and the enactment of key legislation supporting the national development agenda.

As part of its coordination mandate, the State Department convenes periodic roundtable dialogues with MDAs (the Roundtables) which provide a structured platform for joint review and engagement on policy and legislative commitments. These Roundtables have enabled MDAs to review and reflect on the progress of various interventions, reconcile and validate reported progress. They have also provided an opportunity to identify and address emerging legal, policy, and operational conflicts affecting law and policy formulation. The first of these Roundtables were convened between July and August 2023, where the foundational architecture of the GLA was cemented and the initial portfolio of commitments mapped across all MDAs.

Successive rounds of engagement have since been held to validate progress, reconcile reported figures, and identify conflicts impeding effective implementation. The Roundtables that were held from 29th September to 3rd October 2025, had the objective of validating progress reports, reviewing existing commitments to ascertain current priorities, and establishing conflicts and inconsistencies impeding the effective realization of the GLA. That engagement helped to map out the legal, policy, and operational conflicts and inconsistencies related to the achievement of the legislative agenda and make appropriate recommendations for mitigation.

The State Department issued the Report on the implementation of the Government Legislative Agenda at the end of 2025. Being an inaugural Report, the Report provided a reflection on the extent to which the legislative agenda had supported the national development agenda as from year 2022 and what remained to be done. In this respect, His Excellency the Prime Cabinet Secretary, on 11th February 2026, called upon the support and cooperation of Ministries and State Departments in accelerating the delivery of pending policy and legislative commitments within their dockets. In addition to that call, His Excellency the Prime Cabinet Secretary, on 27th February 2026, convened roundtables for the identification of priorities to be accelerated during the remainder of the term of the 13th Parliament. These Roundtables took place from 23rd March 2026 to 24th April 2026 at the Headquarters of the Office of the Prime Cabinet Secretary and Ministry of Foreign and Diaspora Affairs.

1.1 Objectives of GLA Prioritization

The 2026 Prioritization Roundtables were convened for the purpose of identifying policy and legislative commitments for whose development should be prioritized and accelerated for conclusion during the remainder of term of the 13th Parliament.

In pursuit of this overarching objective, the specific objectives of the Roundtables were

–

- a) To engage MDAs on the progress and priorities of their GLA portfolios across the Policy, Legislative and SI segments;
- b) To identify legal, policy and operational conflicts and inconsistencies that are impeding the effective formulation and enactment of legislation and policies, and to make appropriate recommendations for their mitigation;
- c) To inform MDAs of their performance on plenary and committee appearances in Parliament as provided for in the Parliamentary Appearance (Plenary and Committees) Scorecard, 2025;
- d) To sensitize MDAs on the GLA coordination tools including the Public Policy Handbook for Kenya, 2024 and Guidelines on the Development of National Government Policies and Legislations, 2024;
- e) To apprise MDAs on private member Bills impacting their dockets and ascertaining their position on them;
- f) To strengthen inter-agency coordination and promote a whole government approach to the implementation of the Government’s legislative agenda; and
- g) To promote transparency and accountability in the tracking and reporting of GLA commitments.

1.2 Rationale of Prioritization

The convening of the 2026 Prioritization Roundtables was informed by the imminent expiry of the 13th Parliament’s term due to the upcoming 2027 general elections. With a few months remaining before Parliament’s adjournment *sine die*, a defined and non-extendable legislative window exists within which all priority commitments must be concluded.

Legislative and policy initiatives that are not enacted or approved before dissolution will lapse and require reintroduction in the 14th Parliament and the next Cabinet. This shall occasion significant loss of time, resources and institutional momentum. The Roundtables were therefore necessary to enable MDAs collectively identify their priority commitments and agree on concrete acceleration measures to achieve the delivery objective.

The Roundtables were, in addition, intended to strengthen institutional collaboration, improve efficiency in legislative coordination, and enhance Government

responsiveness in delivering transformative policies and legislative reforms that support the national development objectives.

1.3 Scope of Prioritization of the GLA for 2026-2027

The 2026 GLA Roundtable dialogues encompassed all three segments of the Government Legislative Agenda, namely: Policies, Bills and SIs. The Roundtables covered 57 State Departments representing the full spectrum of MDAs with active or planned GLA commitments.

The Roundtables were chaired by the Principal Secretary for Parliamentary Affairs while visiting delegations were substantively led by their respective Principal Secretaries. The prioritization dialogues considered, amongst others, budget availability, the status of the initiatives, strategic alignment with the national development agenda and public interest. State Departments made presentations on their GLA portfolios, guided by a standardized template provided by SDPA after which priorities across the three GLA segments were discussed. Of the 57 State Departments, four recorded nil priorities.

1.4 Guiding Principles

The 2026 Prioritization Roundtables were guided by the following core principles, which are consistent with the constitutional values and principles of governance as set out in Article 10 of the Constitution of Kenya and the broader mandate of the SDPA –

a) Stakeholder Engagement and Participation

The Roundtables recognized the centrality of broad stakeholder engagement in legislative and policy development and continuous consultation among Government institutions.

These guiding principles reflect the SDPA's commitment to strengthening policy and legislative frameworks as well as institutional capacity across all MDAs, and to position the GLA as a credible, transparent and accountable instrument for the realization of Kenya's national development agenda.

b) Inclusivity

The Roundtable process was inclusive in its design and execution, ensuring that all participating State Departments regardless of the size or complexity of their GLA portfolios had an equal opportunity to present, engage and contribute to the collective review.

c) Whole-of-Government Approach

The Roundtables fostered a collaborative, cross-governmental perspective, recognizing that the realization of the national legislative agenda requires coordinated effort across all institutions of the National Executive. This philosophy guards against the fragmented, silo approaches that historically characterized GLA implementation and encourages MDAs to identify shared commitments, resolve conflicts collaboratively, and leverage interdepartmental synergies.

d) Teamwork and Collaboration

Beyond individual MDA accountability, the Roundtables emphasized the importance of teamwork within and across State Departments. The sessions were designed to foster joint problem solving, peer learning and collaborative prioritization, particularly in resolving legal and operational conflicts that cut across multiple MDAs and require coordinated institutional responses.

e) Transparency

All engagements during the Roundtables were conducted in an open and transparent manner, with State Departments encouraged to present accurate and complete information on the status of their GLA commitments, including challenges, delays and areas requiring support.

f) Accountability

State Departments were required to account for the status of their GLA commitments and to provide justification for those needing prioritization. The Roundtable process reinforced institutional accountability for the planning, development and timely completion of legislative and policy initiatives, consistent with SDPA's mandate to continuously coordinate and assess the development of government policy and legislative commitments.

CHAPTER 2: METHODOLOGY

2.0 Introduction

This Chapter outlines the methodology employed in identifying priority initiatives across all participating State Departments. It details the prioritization process which integrated multiple dimensions of analysis. The prioritization of initiatives was influenced by various factors including an initiative's stage in the development process, budget availability, strategic alignment with national development frameworks including Kenya Vision 2030, BETA and MTP IV, urgency and public interest.

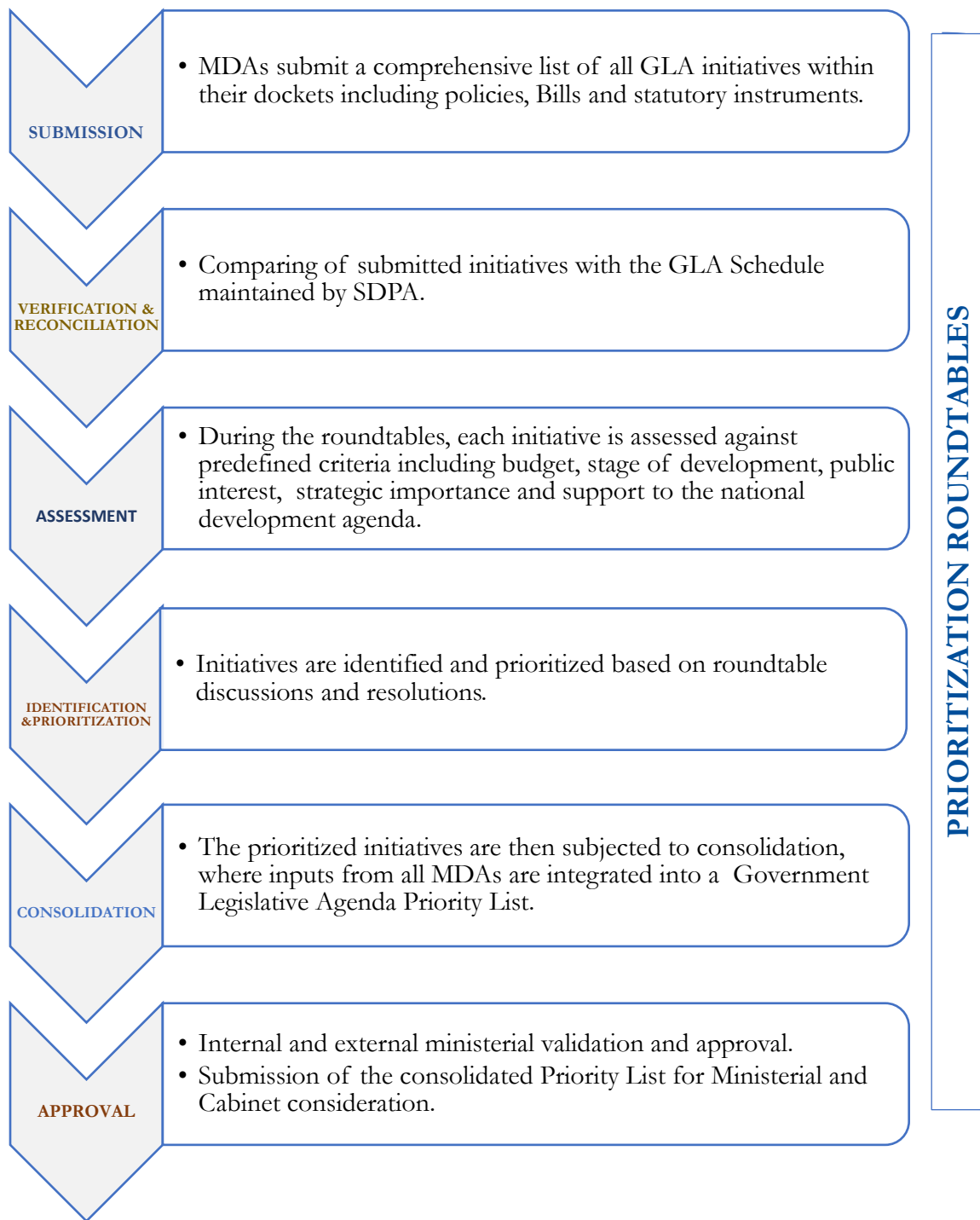
2.1 Methodological Approach

The prioritization exercise relied on qualitative assessment in evaluating and prioritizing policy and legislative initiatives. This was applied through consultations, roundtable discussions, and stakeholder engagements.

2.2 Process Flow

The prioritization exercise adopted a structured and sequential approach to the identification, assessment, and prioritization of policy and legislative initiatives under the three segments. The process cascaded through six interlinked stages, namely: submission, verification and reconciliation, assessment, prioritization, consolidation, and approval. Each stage was a deliberate progression from the previous one, to ensure a systematic, transparent and evidence-based outcome. Figure 1 below provides a summary of the key steps applied during the prioritization exercise.

Figure 1: Key steps in the prioritization process



Submission stage: To kick off the prioritization process, State Departments submitted a comprehensive list of initiatives within their dockets across the segments. This was done to ensure alignment with the GLA Schedule from the outset, to allow for necessary harmonization prior to the Roundtable sessions and identify any additional initiatives not previously recorded in the Schedule. For uniformity, State Departments

were required to submit their reports/presentations through a standardized reporting template circulated by the SDPA at least two days before their scheduled dates of attendance.

Verification & Reconciliation Stage: The respective lists of GLA initiatives submitted by MDAs underwent verification and reconciliation as against the GLA Schedule maintained by SDPA. This greatly facilitated the resolution of discrepancies, confirmation of alignment of initiatives with sectoral mandates, elimination of conflicts, inconsistencies and duplicities across various State Departments as well as identify new initiatives.

Assessment Stage: During each Roundtable dialogue, each initiative proposed for prioritization was evaluated/analyzed against predefined criteria such as budget availability, stage of development, strategic importance and support of the national development agenda. The defined criteria also proved useful in ascertaining the readiness of each initiative for delivery if or once prioritized. This provided a structured basis for analyzing diverse initiatives across all the five clusters and State Departments.

Identification and Prioritization Stage: Each Roundtable dialogue culminated in the identification of initiatives for prioritization across the policy, legislative and statutory instruments segments of the GLA. The identified priorities were then formally adopted as part of the key resolutions of the Roundtables.

Consolidation: All prioritized initiatives from across the participating State Departments were thereafter consolidated into a GLA Priority List. This was essential for purposes of ensuring coherence and alignment across Government as all responsible entities gear up for the accelerated delivery of the priorities during the 5th and 6th sessions of the 13th Parliament.

Approval stage: Ultimately, the approval stage entailed the consolidated priority list for Ministerial and Cabinet consideration as the Government's Policy and Legislative Priority Programme for the remainder of the term of the 13th Parliament.

2.3. An Overview of the Assessment and Prioritization Criteria

The prioritization of policy and legislative initiatives was guided by a multi-criteria assessment framework designed to ensure that decisions were evidence-based, transparent and objective.

Strategic Importance: The focus here was heavily on the extent to which an initiative aligns with national development agenda, including priority sector programmes under BETA.

Stage of development: Policy and legislative initiatives were assessed based on their progress along the development cycle, as prescribed by the Guidelines for the Development of National Government Policy and Legislation, 2024. Initiatives fell at various stages of development including Initiation, Drafting, Public Participation, Ministerial Approval, Cabinet Consideration and Approval, and Transmittal to Parliament. Generally, initiatives at more advanced stages demonstrated greater readiness for finalization. Recognizing that some identified priorities were at the early stages of development, the Roundtables delved into comprehensive discussions around their strategic importance as well as practical acceleration measures and strategies to enable the successful completion of the initiatives within the remainder of the term of the 13th Parliament.

Budget availability: This criterion was critical in evaluating the readiness for delivery of an initiative based on budget availability. It was important to ascertain whether there is/was an existing budgetary allocation and adequate resources to support both the development and completion of the initiative. Alive to the funding challenges encountered by MDAs in implementing the Government legislative agenda, the SDPA engaged the affected State Departments on their ongoing and proposed intervening measures towards securing adequate funding for purposes of the delivery of the prioritized initiatives.

Urgency and Public interest: The prioritization framework further incorporated urgency and public interest, assessing whether prioritized initiative respond/responded to emerging issues, crises, or significant socio-economic needs, as well as the level of public demand.

2.4. Integration of Private Members' Bills into Government Priorities

The SDPA adopted the position that Private Members' Bills may also be incorporated into the GLA priorities using the same assessment applied to government initiatives. However, in such instances, additional considerations were factored in. This included alignment with Government policy, potential overlaps with existing or planned government initiatives, and whether the respective State Department was in support of the subject private member Bill. This ensured that such Bills were evaluated comprehensively alongside the broader Government legislative agenda. Consequently,

the verification and reconciliation stage was critical in ensuring associated or competing private member Bills are harmonized in the GLA Priority List.

2.5. Data Collection Methods

The assessment process relied upon data obtained through multiple sources to ensure accuracy, reliability and comprehensive analysis. The data collection process was characterized by structured Roundtable discussions with State Departments, use of standardized submission templates, checklists and review of policy and legislative initiatives. All State Departments were required to formally submit a list of all policy, legislative and statutory instrument initiatives within their dockets.

Additional information was obtained from strategic plans, Government policy documents, MTP IV and BETA, Cabinet decisions and existing GLA records to support the assessment and validation of submissions.

The application of standardized tools and consultations ensured consistency in data collection, enhanced stakeholder participation and promoted transparency in the prioritization process.

2.6. Data Analysis

The data analysis process entailed the review and presentation of data on the initiatives submitted by MDAs based on the predefined criteria; namely stage of development, budget, cluster, priority and linkage to BETA. The process of analysis also involved the verification and validation of submissions to ensure consistency, accuracy, and alignment with Government priorities and the GLA framework.

2.7. Quality Assurance and Validation

For purposes of safeguarding the integrity, reliability and credibility of the methodology, several quality assurance measures were applied. Data was subjected to cross-validation to identify and remedy inconsistencies. Feedback mechanisms were also incorporated, allowing MDAs to provide clarification where necessary. In addition, the SDPA engaged all State Departments through immediate post-roundtable follow-up correspondence attaching each roundtable's matrix of resolutions, for purposes of concurrence on the identified priorities, as well as any clarification where applicable.

2.8. Limitations

Despite its strengths, the methodology may be subject to certain limitations. These include the possibility of incomplete or inconsistent data submissions from MDAs,

changes in political or fiscal priorities, varying institutional capacities and time constraints inherent in policy and legislative development processes. To mitigate these challenges, the methodology incorporated continuous updates and iterative reviews of the Government legislative agenda to maintain its relevance and responsiveness to evolving circumstances.

CHAPTER 3: THE FINDINGS, ANALYSIS AND PRIORITIZATION

3.0 Overview

This Chapter provides an overview of the findings, analysis and outcomes of the Prioritization Roundtables. It also provides highlights of the GLA portfolio before and after the Roundtables.

The GLA Programme is developed in the context of global, regional and national development frameworks and priorities that play a pivotal role in shaping the future of the nation. Specifically, the Report appreciates the United Nations 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development; African Union Agenda 2063; East Africa Community Vision 2050; Constitution of Kenya; Kenya Vision 2030; MTP IV; and BETA. The aspirations and agendas are interconnected and outline strategies for inclusive growth, poverty reduction, and job creation to foster sustainable development and prosperity.

The GLA priorities are intended to support the delivery of these agendas and aspirations in the Kenyan context.

3.1 The GLA Pre-prioritization

The GLA portfolio before the Prioritization Roundtables had a total of 1,308 initiatives comprising 289 policies, 354 legislative and 665 statutory instruments. The portfolio served as the baseline from which MDAs were invited to identify initiatives for prioritization as summarized in Table 1 below.

Of the 1,308 initiatives, 432 initiatives (33.0%) were deemed excluded from the prioritization exercise as their development processes had been concluded in various ways. Concluded initiatives are largely those that are either recorded as approved, published or under implementation. This category also includes those that are recorded as Deferred, Annulled, Withdrawn, Lapsed or Lost as they too have completed the development cycle. Table 2 below summarizes the exclusions by status and segment.

3.2 Prioritized Initiatives

3.2.1 Prioritized Initiatives by Segment

The Roundtables provided a consultative platform for the State Department and MDAs to dialogue and identify key initiatives that are critical in achieving the national development agenda.

Recognizing the urgency of the legislative calendar, **558** crucial initiatives were identified for prioritization and accelerated delivery during the remainder of the term of the 13th Parliament. This robust pipeline, consisting of **142 Policies, 161 Bills, and 255** Statutory Instruments, as set out in Table 4 below, reflects an acceleration in the government's commitment to fully mainstream BETA into Kenya's policy and regulatory frameworks. The 558 priorities represent the heavy-lifting phase for the remainder of the term of the 13th Parliament.

Annex 1, Annex 2 and Annex 3 list the Policy, Legislative and Statutory Instrument Commitments that have been prioritized for delivery during the remainder of the term of the 13th Parliament.

The number of prioritized initiatives has been revised from 565 to 558 because following initiatives were reported and prioritized by more than one State Department

—

- 1) The Statute Law (Miscellaneous Amendments) Bill, 2023 (State Law Office and Energy).
- 2) Kenya Agricultural Data, Information and Digital Policy, 2026 (Agriculture and Livestock Development).
- 3) The Food and Feed Safety Control Coordination Bill (Agriculture and Livestock Development).

- 4) The Government Assets Valuation Policy Framework for the Public Sector, 2025 (Public Investments and Assets Management and the National Treasury).
- 5) Disability Mainstreaming Policy (Medical Services and Public Health and Professional Standards).
- 6) The Public Finance Management (Prisons Enterprise Fund) Regulations, 2025. (The National Treasury and Correctional Services).
- 7) The Education Appeals Tribunal, 2025 (Basic Education and Higher Education).

It is to also be noted that 15 Statutory instruments by State Department of Shipping and Maritime Affairs are bundled under a) the MARPOL Convention Regulations (7 sets of regulations) and b) the Safety of Life at Sea (SOLAS) Convention Regulations (11 sets of regulations).

3.2.2 Prioritized Initiatives by Cluster

The Finance and Production cluster leads with 149 identified priorities, reflecting the centrality of economic growth and fiscal reform to BETA. This is closely followed by Infrastructure with 147 priorities underscoring sustained investment in transport, energy, and digital connectivity. 103 priority initiatives have been prioritized in the social cluster signaling a strong focus on institutional strengthening and enhancement of social services covering reforms in areas such as education, health, and social protection.

87 initiatives have been prioritized in the Governance and Public Administration cluster while the Environment and Natural Resources cluster has identified 72 priorities representing a targeted commitment to climate resilience and natural resource management. A distribution of the priorities by cluster is highlighted in Table 5 below.

Some of the identified priorities are set out in the cluster highlights below –

a) Finance and Production

This cluster holds the bulk of the economic empowerment agenda, focusing on the sectors that employ majority of Kenyans. BETA's goal is to transition the economy from a raw produce economy to a value addition economy with strengthened value chains, and from informal businesses to formalized businesses.

To ensure farmers earn more from their input, the Administration has prioritized targeted reforms like the *Coffee Industry Policy* and the *Tea Industry Policy*. This is backed by legislative teeth such as *the Livestock Bill, 2024*, and *the Food & Feed Safety Coordination Bill*, which aim to standardize Kenyan produce for global markets.

To support small businesses and startups, *the MSME Policy, 2025*, and *the MSME Formalization Policy* have been prioritized. Crucially, *the Startup Bill, 2022*, is prioritized to create a legal framework that nurtures innovation and attracts venture capital.

The Local Content Bill and the *Anti Counterfeit Bill, 2025*, are designed to protect local manufacturers and ensure that government and private sector projects utilize Kenyan goods and services.

b) Infrastructure

This cluster translates BETA's physical and technological promises into actionable projects, focusing on housing, technology, and connectivity.

The Digital Frontier: To cement Kenya as a tech hub, the Administration is prioritizing *the Emerging and AI Technologies Policy*, *the National Cyberspace Policy*, and *Data Governance Policy*. Legislatively, *the Technopolis Bill (now law)* will provide for the statutory backing for tech cities, while *the ICT Authority Bill, 2026*, aims to streamline digital governance within Government as a key enabler of the Digital superhighway promise.

Dignified Housing: Expanding on *the Affordable Housing Act*, the agenda targets the root of urban poverty together with *the Slum Upgrading and Prevention Bill*, and *the Harmonization of Planning Laws Bill*.

Transport and Logistics: Priorities include *the National Toll Policy*, which will dictate how road infrastructure is funded and maintained, and a suite of *Civil Aviation Regulations* aimed at modernizing airspace management.

c) Social Cluster

BETA relies on a healthy, educated, and protected population. The prioritized initiatives in this cluster aim to overhaul the social safety net and service delivery.

Universal Health Coverage (UHC): Building on recent digital health laws, the focus is now on quality and specific care. This includes *the Quality Healthcare and Patient Safety Bill 2025*, and *the Blood, Cells, Tissues and Organs Bill*.

Education Reforms: A massive overhaul of the education policy and statutory framework is underway, including *the Basic Education Bill, 2024*, *the TVET Bill, the Universities Bill, 2024*, *the Teacher Education and Training Bill, 2024*, *the Tertiary Education Placement and Funding Bill* ensuring the curriculum aligns with market needs and education is made accessible to all. This massive overhaul of the education legislative framework is supported by the proposed *Sessional Paper on the National Education Policy*.

Social Protection: *The Older Persons Bill, 2026*, alongside specific regulations *under* the recently enacted *Persons with Disabilities Act*, aims to ensure the most vulnerable are not left behind in the economic transformation.

d) Environment and Natural Resources

This cluster ensures that economic transformation does not come at the expense of the environment, while also capitalizing on new green economic frontiers.

Carbon Markets & Climate: A major priority is capitalizing green finance through *the Climate Change (Carbon Registry) Regulations, 2026*, and *the Climate Change (Carbon Trading) Regulations, 2026*.

Resource Management: The agenda *includes the Forest Conservation and Management Bill 2025 (now law)*, and regulations on benefit-sharing, ensuring local communities profit directly from the conservation of natural resources.

e) Governance and Public Administration

None of the BETA pillars can succeed without an efficient, transparent, and accountable public service.

Anti-Corruption and Integrity: *The Whistle-blower Bill, 2025*, and *the Anti-Corruption Laws (Amendment) Bill, 2025*, are prioritized to seal revenue leaks and ensure public funds are directed to BETA projects. This is supported by *the Conflict-of-Interest Regulations*.

Public Service Efficiency and Effectiveness: *The Public Service Transformation Policy* and *the Huduma Kenya One Stop-Shop Government Services Bill* aim to make government services seamless, digitized, and citizen-centric. In addition, *the Public Service Performance Management Bill* aims to boost government’s efficiency by providing a legal framework for performance management for the entire public service with performance contracting proposed as Kenya’s anchor performance management tool.

3.2.3 Prioritized Initiatives by State Department

The distribution of initiatives across State Departments in the different clusters reveals clear priorities, with notable variations across the three segments as demonstrated in Table 6 below.

The State Department for Shipping and Maritime Affairs has the highest number of prioritized initiatives (29) in the Environment and Natural Resources cluster followed by State Department for Forestry with 9 priorities. The State Department for ASALs & Regional Development has also registered a significant policy footprint, accounting for 7 policy priorities.

With a combined total of 78 priorities, the National Treasury, with 51 initiatives, and the State Department for Public Investments and Assets Management with 27 initiatives, account for a substantial share of the priorities in the Finance and Production cluster. Both State Departments register a notably high number of priority commitments in the SIs segment. The State Departments for Industry, Livestock Development and Economic Planning with 23, 10 and 10 initiatives respectively, also record notable activity, reflecting a mix of legislative, policy, and regulatory interventions aimed at strengthening sector performance.

The State Department for Internal Security & National Administration has the highest number of priorities, 26 of them, in the Governance and Public Administration cluster. It is followed by the State Law Office with 14 initiatives. The State Departments for Immigration and Citizen Services and that of Science Research and Innovation have 11 and 9 priorities respectively.

147 initiatives have been prioritized in the Infrastructure cluster. With 42 identified initiatives, the State Department for Aviation & Aerospace Development records the highest number of priorities in the cluster followed by the State Department for Broadcasting and Telecommunications with 22 initiatives. The State Department for Energy identified 15 priorities while the State Department for ICT and the Digital Economy identified 14 of them showing substantial engagement and reflecting strong sector modernization efforts. 10 initiatives have been prioritized in the State Department for Petroleum closing the number of State Departments with 10 or more priorities within the Infrastructure cluster.

On its part, the Social cluster accounts for 103 priorities, with a relatively balanced distribution across all segments. The State Departments for Basic Education and that

of Public Service and Human Capital Development record the highest number of priorities with strong contributions from both legislative and statutory instrument segments totaling 18 and 13 initiatives respectively. Other State Departments, including Children Services (12), Sports (9), Social Protection & Senior Citizens Affairs (9), Labour & Skills Development (8), and Medical Services (8) demonstrate moderate but steady engagement across reform areas.

3.2.4 Status of Prioritized Initiatives

Out of the 558 prioritized initiatives, 295 of them (52.8%) comprising 92 policies, 42 bills and 74 statutory instruments are at the initial stages of development i.e. Initiation (50), Drafting (130) and Public Participation (112). 195 (34.88 %) initiatives made up of 47 policies, 64 bills and 85 statutory instruments are at advanced stages of development i.e. AG Formal Drafting (57), Ministerial Approval (67), Gazette Publication (24), Cabinet Consideration and Approval (34) and Transmittal to Parliament (13). There are 67 initiatives (4 Sessional Papers, 26 Bills and 37 Statutory Instruments) that are awaiting parliamentary consideration. Table 7 below provides a summary of the prioritized initiatives across the various development stages.

It is to be noted that four (4) of the 558 priorities have since been approved by Parliament post the Roundtables i.e. *the Technopolis Bill (NA Bill No. 6 of 2024)*, *the Forest Conservation and Management (Amendment) Bill, 2025 (NA 38 of 2025)*, *the Equalization Fund Appropriation Bill, 2025 (NA Bill No. 21 of 2025)* and *the Capital Markets (Coffee Exchange) (Fees) Regulations 2024 (LN 9 of 2024)*.

3.3 Impact of the Identified Priorities on BETA

3.3.1 Introduction

193 of the prioritized initiatives are directly linked to the BETA commitments under MTP IV while the remaining 365 signal an aggressive expansion of the government's ambitions to deliver on BETA. These initiatives are at different stages of implementation, including Drafting, AG Formal Drafting, Ministerial Approval, Public Participation, Cabinet Consideration and Approval, Transmittal to Parliament, Parliamentary Consideration and Gazette Publication.

Notably, several of the initiatives have reached advanced stages of implementation, demonstrating significant progress in the reform pipeline. Some are already at cabinet consideration and approval stage, including *the MSME Policy, 2025*, *the ICT Authority Bill, 2026*, *the Creative Economy Bill, 2026*, *the National Land Reclamation Policy, 2026*, *the Labour Migration Management Bill, 2025*, *the Social Risk and Impact Management Policy, 2023*, and *the Sessional Paper on a Policy Framework for Education Reforms in Kenya, 2024*.

Others have progressed to transmittal to Parliament or parliamentary consideration stages. They include the *Trade Descriptions (Amendment) Bill, 2026*, *the National Care Policy*, *the National Policy on Women Economic Empowerment*, *the Fisheries Management and Development Bill, 2023*, *the Cooperative Societies Bill, 2024*, *the Sacco Societies (Amendment) Bill, 2025*, *the Technopolis Bill (now law)*, *the Quality Healthcare and Patient Safety Bill, 2025*, *the Culture Bill, 2024*, and *the National Energy Policy, 2025*.

These initiatives are significant because they directly support the five BETA pillars by supporting MSME growth, cooperatives and access to finance; agriculture, fisheries and productive land use; affordable housing and orderly settlement; healthcare quality and patient safety; and digital transformation, the creative economy and innovation. Their prioritization therefore demonstrates that the ongoing initiatives are not merely a forward-looking reform list, but a structured implementation pipeline through which MDAs are expected to deepen the gains already achieved under the implemented initiatives and accelerate delivery of the BETA agenda before 2027.

The 45 BETA linked initiatives that are at implementation stage have already laid an important foundation by operationalizing reforms in agriculture, MSME financing, housing, health, fisheries, climate change, social protection and governance. These achievements show that MDAs have made tangible progress in translating MTPIV

commitments into practical policy, legal and regulatory instruments that support inclusive economic transformation.

The 193 ongoing initiatives build on this foundation and represent the next phase of implementation towards 2027. If finalized within the current term, they will deepen the gains already made by strengthening agricultural productivity and food security, expanding MSME growth and access to finance, supporting affordable housing and orderly settlement, improving healthcare delivery, and accelerating the digital superhighway and creative economy. Collectively, the implemented and ongoing initiatives provide a comprehensive pathway for realizing BETA by ensuring that Government reforms remain focused on jobs, production, household welfare, enterprise development and inclusive national transformation.

An assessment of most of the BETA linked priorities under MTPIV reveals that they are at the formative stages of formulation. 45 of them are still in the drafting and initiation stages while 32 have transited to public participation. Those that have reached the Ministerial Approval and AG Formal Drafting stages are 40 and 33 respectively. 13 initiatives are at the cabinet approval stage while 26 initiatives are ready for parliamentary processing. Table 9 below provides a summary of the status of the BETA linked priorities across the various stages in the development process. This data signals the need for a big push to accelerate delivery in the remaining months.

3.3.2 Policy priorities

The ongoing policy initiatives are important because they provide the strategic foundation for sectoral transformation under BETA. In the agriculture pillar, initiatives such as the *Coffee Industry Policy*, *Tea Industry Policy*, *National Aquaculture Policy*, *Policy Framework for Sustainable Financing and Subsidy Management in Agriculture* and *National Land Reclamation Policy* are particularly significant. These policies are intended to address productivity, financing, value chain development, food security and market access in key agricultural and blue economy sectors. By focusing on coffee, tea, aquaculture, agricultural financing and land reclamation, the initiatives support BETA's goal of increasing production, reducing food import dependence, improving farmer incomes and strengthening agricultural value chains as engines of job creation and rural transformation.

The policy pipeline also directly addresses other BETA pillars. *The MSME Policy, 2025*, and *the MSME Formalization Policy*, support the MSME pillar by providing a framework for enterprise growth, access to finance, formalization and expansion of small businesses. *The National Digital Policy*, *the National E-Commerce Policy* and *the Creative Economy Policy* directly support the digital superhighway and creative economy pillar by strengthening digital infrastructure, online trade, innovation, digital services, youth talent and creative industries.

The National Public Works Policy, National Land Policy, National Land Surveying and Mapping Policy, the National Energy Policy, and the National Petroleum Policy support housing, settlement and enabling infrastructure by improving land administration, built environment planning and reliable energy access.

Further, *the National Care Policy, National Policy on Women Economic Empowerment, Social Risk and Impact Management Policy, the National Children Policy, 2025, and policies on older persons and affirmative action* strengthen the inclusive and social protection dimension of BETA by ensuring that women, children, older persons, vulnerable groups and marginalized citizens are supported to participate in and benefit from economic transformation.

3.3.3 Legislative Priorities

The legislative initiatives are central to BETA because they create binding legal frameworks for implementing priority reforms. Under the agriculture and blue economy pillar, the *Animal Health Bill, Livestock Bill and Fisheries Management and Development Bill* are among the most important initiatives. These Bills are intended to strengthen animal health systems, regulate livestock development, improve fisheries governance and support sustainable use of livestock and fisheries resources. They therefore contribute to food security, disease control, value addition, export readiness and income generation for farmers, pastoralists, fisherfolk and related MSMEs. *The Merchant Shipping (Amendment) Bill* also supports the blue economy and maritime transport by improving the legal framework for shipping, cabotage and maritime trade, which are important for logistics, coastal livelihoods and economic competitiveness.

The legislative initiatives also give direct effect to the MSME, housing, healthcare and digital pillars. *The Cooperative Societies Bill, Sacco Societies (Amendment) Bill and Amendment of the Micro and Small Enterprise Act* are particularly important because cooperatives, SACCOs and MSMEs are key vehicles for affordable credit, enterprise development and bottom-up economic empowerment.

The amendment of the Affordable Housing Act, the Buildings Bill, the Land Surveying and Mapping Bill and the Physical Planners Registration (Amendment) Bill support the housing and settlement pillar by strengthening the legal environment for affordable housing delivery, built environment standards, land administration and professional regulation.

In healthcare, *the Quality Healthcare and Patient Safety Bill* support improved health service standards, access to quality healthcare and patient safety.

The ICT Authority Bill, Data Protection Act review, National Addressing Systems Bill, Creative Economy Bill and Technopolis Bill (now law) support the digital superhighway and creative economy by strengthening digital governance, data protection, national addressing, innovation, creative industries and the Konza Technopolis framework.

Further, *the two thirds gender principle implementation proposals, the Ethnic Minorities and Marginalized Communities Bill, 2025, and the Older Persons Bill*, strengthen the inclusive and social protection dimension of BETA by ensuring that women, older persons, vulnerable groups and marginalized citizens are supported to participate in and benefit from economic transformation

3.3.4 Statutory Instrument Priorities

Statutory Instruments are important because they operationalize policy and legislation by providing detailed rules for implementation. In the agriculture and MSME pillars, *the Tea Registration and Licensing Regulations, Tea Levy Regulations and SACCO Societies Levy Order* are notable because they support structured regulation, financing and governance of key productive sectors. The tea regulations support one of Kenya's most important agricultural value chains by improving registration, licensing, levy administration and sector organization, thereby supporting farmer incomes, exports and value chain stability. The SACCO-related instrument supports the cooperative financial system, which is central to BETA's approach of expanding access to affordable credit for ordinary citizens, small traders, farmers and MSMEs.

A significant number of statutory instruments also support enabling infrastructure, climate resilience, blue economy and energy access. *The Petroleum Regulations and Energy Regulations, including those on solar photovoltaic systems, electricity tariffs, mini-grids, geothermal resources, electricity reliability, quality of supply and open access*, are important because energy is an enabler of agriculture, housing, manufacturing, MSMEs and the digital economy.

The Climate Change Carbon Trading Regulations support green investment and climate financing, while *the Forest Conservation and Management Regulations on charcoal, gum and resins, sustainable forest management and private forest registration* promote sustainable livelihoods, environmental protection and community participation. In the blue economy, *the Fisheries Management and Development Monitoring, Control and Surveillance Regulations* strengthen fisheries governance and resource protection. Collectively, these instruments support BETA by improving the regulatory environment for production, investment, sustainability, livelihoods and service delivery.

3.4 The GLA Post-prioritization

The number of GLA initiatives at the end of the prioritization Roundtables in April 2026 increased from **1,308 to 1,358**. This comprises **299** policy initiatives, **339** legislative initiatives, and **720** statutory initiatives. This increase was occasioned by the review of the departmental presentations which signals that the Roundtables provided MDAs with an opportunity to update SDPA on the status of their GLA portfolios.

Of these commitments, **326** have been concluded, **938** are ongoing and **94** have been discontinued. The number of ongoing initiatives has increased from **846** to **938** while the discontinued and abandoned initiatives have reduced from **121** to **94**. It is important to note that various MDAs have since revisited hitherto abandoned or discontinued initiatives prompting the review of their statuses from abandoned/discontinued to ongoing. This further showcases the living nature of the government legislative agenda across government.

The summary of GLA initiatives by status is shown in Table 11 below.

Figure 2: GLA status by broad category

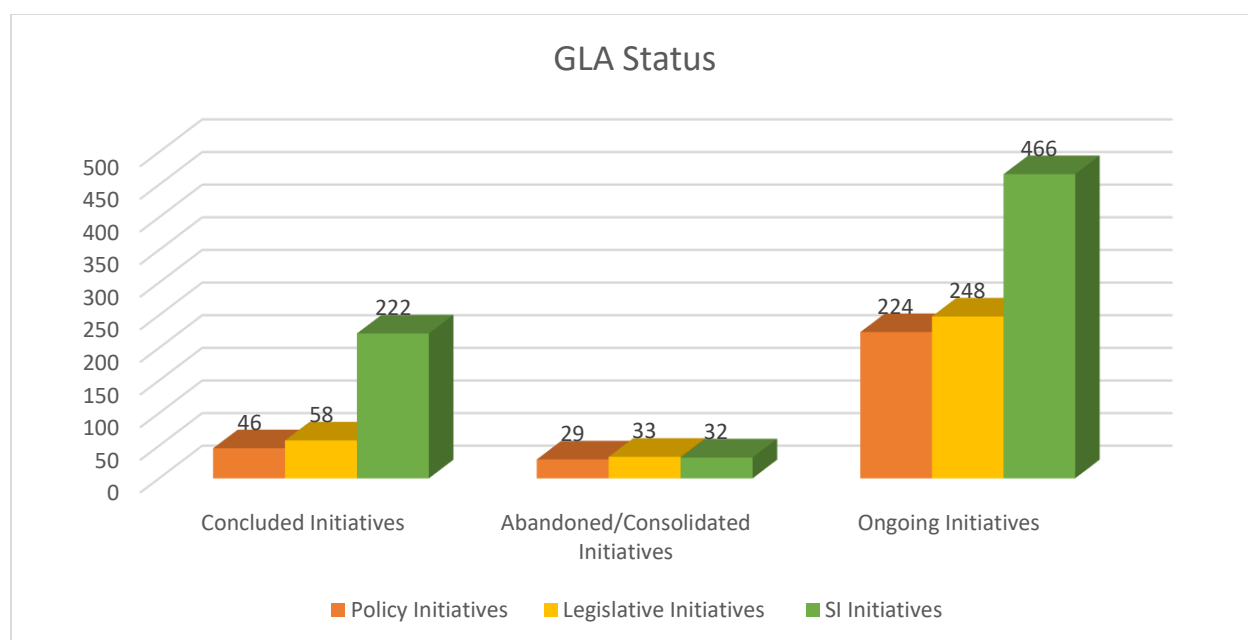


Table 11 above shows that the SIs segment has recorded the highest conclusion numbers (222) compared to the other two segments. The policy and legislative segments have recorded the conclusion of 46 and 58 initiatives respectively.

3.5 Conclusion

- 1) The Roundtable dialogues have provided an opportunity for the Government to review and align the GLA programme with the national development agenda and emerging issues and trends.

- 2) There is need to accelerate the digitalization of GLA monitoring and reporting under the proposed Integrated Project for Acceleration of the Government Legislative Agenda (IPAGLA).
- 3) There is need to enhance resource mobilization efforts to support the delivery of the GLA as an enabler of the national development agenda.
- 4) The regular tracking and reporting on the progress of the priority initiatives is key in unlocking bottlenecks impeding the realization of the GLA programme.
- 5) There is need to strengthen the linkage between the GLA, the national development planning framework and Performance Contracting Guidelines.
- 6) The BETA related initiatives demonstrate a coherent progression in the implementation of the BETA.

CHAPTER 4: IMPLEMENTATION AND MONITORING OF PRIORITIES

4.0 Overview

The Chapter outlines the framework under which the acceleration of the development of the identified priorities is to be coordinated and monitored. This includes the organizational inter-relationships within the National Executive as well as with the Cabinet approved framework for the coordination of government business specific to the GLA and Parliamentary Liaison. It outlines the implementation plan, highlights the Strategic Plan operationalization, Monitoring framework and the organizational structure to aid in the delivery of the priority initiatives.

4.1 Implementation Plan

From the analysis in the previous chapter, the MDAs have prioritized a total of 558 initiatives to be delivered before the end of the term of the 13th Parliament. Each State Department is required to prepare a Roadmap for the delivery of the prioritized initiatives. The Departmental Roadmaps will be consolidated to form ministerial Roadmaps of the prioritized initiatives in each Ministry.

To deliver on this, there is need to enhance institutional collaboration including pooling of key resources to help in addressing the challenges that may hinder the effective implementation of those Roadmaps. All initiatives to be accelerates should be so accelerated and in compliance with the relevant sections of the Guidelines for the Development of National Government Policy and Legislation, 2024, the Attorney-General's Circular on the Processing of Proposed Legislation, 2022 and the Public Policy Handbook for Kenya.

4.1.1 Key coordination actions

The SDPA will lead engagements with various key stakeholders in the development cycle to foster the synergy required to ensure timely realization of the identified priorities. This will also assist in addressing various challenges identified by the participating State Departments e.g. funding, delayed action by process stakeholders, overlaps, conflicts and inconsistencies and administrative and systemic barriers. Table 12 below highlights the key action areas, key stakeholders as well as the initial distribution of the priorities across stages.

4.1.2 Action plans on key resolutions

The State Department for Parliamentary Affairs will prepare an action plan of all Resolutions emanating from the Roundtable and post-Roundtable engagements to guide in unlocking the bottlenecks impeding the delivery of specific initiatives.

4.2 Coordination Framework

This Report will be implemented through cascading responsibilities and be undertaken through coordination and collaboration with various actors as discussed below:

4.2.1 The Office of the Prime Cabinet Secretary

The Office of the Prime Cabinet Secretary is established with the mandate to, inter alia, assist the President and the Deputy President in the coordination of Government Ministries and State Departments and; coordinate the implementation of the national government legislative agenda across all Ministries and State Departments in consultation with the Leadership of Parliament. As chair of the Steering Committee on the Government Legislative Agenda and Parliamentary Liaison (SCGLAPL), the Prime Cabinet Secretary will give the overall policy direction in the coordination of the GLA

and Parliamentary Liaison. The OPCS is supported in the GLA coordination function by the SDPA.

4.2.2 The Steering Committee on the Government Legislative Agenda and Parliamentary Liaison

The Steering Committee established under the Guidelines on the Framework for Coordination and Supervision of Government Operations and Business Across Ministries, State Departments and Agencies (Rev. 2024) is chaired by the Prime Cabinet Secretary and deputized by the Attorney-General. The Principal Secretary, State Department for Parliamentary Affairs is the Secretary to the Steering Committee. The Steering Committee will coordinate the delivery of the prioritized initiatives by providing overall guidance and oversight. It will specifically –

- 1) Provide timely guidance and direction on the appropriate measures to be taken to address the challenges constraining the realization of the legal framework necessary to achieve the National Government Development Agenda;
- 2) Monitor and evaluate the progress of policy and legislation to ensure the objectives of the National Government intended in the legal framework are met in good time and are constitutional.

Pursuant to the Guidelines on the Development of National Government Policy and Legislation, 2024, all Ministries and State Department shall be expected to bring all challenges that require high level unlocking to the attention of the Office of the Prime Cabinet Secretary and State Department for Parliamentary Affairs for timely consideration and resolution.

4.2.3 State Department for Parliamentary Affairs

The role of SDPA is anchored of its mandate to coordinate the implementation of the National Government’s legislative agenda across all Ministries and State Departments in consultation with, and for transmission to the Party/Coalition Leadership in Parliament. SDPA has been the lead agency in the Coordination of the identification, prioritization and enactment of policies and legislation necessary to achieve the national development agenda. The state department will thus play a critical role in ensuring timely guidance and direction on the appropriate measures to be undertaken to address challenges constraining the realization of the prioritized initiatives. As part of its key function SPDA will monitor and evaluate the progress of policy and legislative initiatives for the timely realization of the proposed Roadmaps. It will also carry out

oversight to ensure public participation and the involvement of other stakeholders in the development of policies and legislation by MDAs.

4.2.4 Ministries, Departments and Agencies

MDAs will implement the Roadmaps and ensure allocation of key financial and technical resources required to deliver the Roadmaps.

4.3 Liaison with Parliament

The Constitution of Kenya vests in Parliament the mandate of law-making, oversight and representation of the people. Article 94(5) of the Constitution provides that “No person or body, other than Parliament, has the power to make provision having the force of law in Kenya except under authority conferred by this Constitution or by legislation.” Liaison with Parliament is therefore critical in delivering the GLA. Liaison with Parliament for the effective dispatch of the GLA is principally through the Coalition/Party Leadership in both Houses of Parliament and as guided under the envisaged Parliamentary Liaison Framework.

4.4 Tracking and Reporting

As part of the execution of the day-to-day coordination function, the SDPA will oversee monitoring, tracking and reporting of the implementation of the GLA Policy and Legislative Priority Programme based on the coordination tools that have been put in place. Pursuant to the Guidelines on the Development of National Government Policy and Legislation, 2024, State Departments will provide quarterly reports on progress of all the initiatives under development. The reports shall be submitted not later than the 10th day following the end of each Quarter.
